Our whitewater rafting experience puts you against the roaring Arkansas River as it fights its way along the sheer rock walls of Brown's Canyon in the heart of colorful Colorado. After receiving training from our certified River Guides, your crew will join them for some seriously and exciting – often times wet – white-water rafting. At a length of 1,459 miles, the Arkansas River is the 4th longest river in the United States and the 16th longest on the planet.

Whitewater rafting is only part of the RMHAB experience. The challenge of the rugged Rocky Mountains still awaits your Crew. Our mountain program offers a diverse range of activities to meet the needs and desires of everyone attending RMHAB. There are five mountain program options from day hikes to overnight backpacking treks at elevations ranging from 8,500' to 14,000'.

RMHAB offers one and two-day fishing trips to scenic mountain lakes for those who want to sample some magnificent Colorado fishing.

RMHAB provides an unrivaled mountain bike program and guides for 1-day and 2-day overnights. You will be taken to the top of the Continental Divide all the way to the depths of the Arkansas River Valley. If a self guided trek is more your style, then take your Crew out on their own bike trek to explore mountain trails and speed through the alpine meadows.

Enjoy an unforgettable week of traditional Scout camping. New Scouts will love the "Baden Powell program," for Scouts working on Tenderfoot through First Class rank. A rigidly flexible program concept designed to provide an opportunity to work in outdoor skills, handicrafts, shooting sports, and ecology, where boys have fun while attaining rank advancement and earning merit badges

Two New Programs Offered:

Patrol Cooking: Meal preparation is unquestionably one of the Troop's greatest opportunities to strengthen it's operation, and the operation of its patrols. Meal preparation brings the patrol method to life by providing the Patrol Leader with the challenge to lead his patrol members in accomplishing a significant task; which is, to properly prepare a meal, enjoy it, and clean up afterwards. All Scouts want to eat, and Patrol members quickly learn the importance of leadership and teamwork as the Patrol learns the importance of being prepared. \$195.00 for boys, \$112.50 for adults.

Out-Post High Adventure Program: Take advantage of this program which includes hiking, mountain biking, GPS/GEO Cashing, Rock Climbing, and shotgun shooting. \$275.00 for youth and adults. You can go on a one day white-water rafting trip, in conjunction with the Rocky Mountain High Adventure Base program on the Arkansas River for an additional \$50.00.
