Jamboree Gateways

At a recent meeting of the Jamboree's Health & Safety Committee, the following standards regarding gateways were set:

- The height of troop gateways will be limited to a maximum of 10 feet! No electrical components. The 10' height restriction includes flagpoles which must be of non-conductive material.
- There will be NO climbing allowed in the erection of unit gateways. No tents or other unit components will be allowed within the "fall zone" of the gateways.
- Metal poles for tents are permissible; however no tents may exceed 10 feet in height.

Food Distribution

Bart Green, Director of the Jamboree Food Service Group announced that "kiosk lunches" will now be available during staff week to relieve the staff and sub camp dining rooms from having to prep for lunch.



Bart also announced that sub camp commissary food distribution will be by troop, not patrol. Within the distribution, however, most items will be sized for patrol distribution. The bulk items will need to be divided between patrols (containers of fruit, etc.).

Phone Service



AT&T has committed major sponsorship to the Jamboree. As part of their commitment, they have been all over the site planning the communications network. They plan to place numerous portable cellular towers featuring "closed and open" systems.

John Alline, Jamboree Director, also announced that cell phone recharging will NOT be allowed in the medical tents. There may be recharging

stations available for a fee. While there will be no pay phones, he indicated that there may be a tent sponsored by AT&T with cell phones available for scouts to call home for free.

Trademarks & Patches

Any local council desiring to incorporate a commercial, third-party mark, word or phrase into its 2010 Jamboree CSP must have both written permission from the commercial mark owner and the authorization of the Boy Scouts of America National Council. The most expedient way to secure this authorization is to follow the processes previously established for BSA Officially Licensed products or for BSA Custom product orders placed through Supply Group.

As with any patch, the local council needs only to submit their designs/orders to a BSA Licensee, or to BSA Supply, along with written authorizations (on company letterhead) from the third-party for use of those marks/logos. BSA's Licensed and Custom Products team will take care of gaining the proper authorization from BSA Legal as is required for such 2010 Jamboree CSPs.
